

Student Procedure for On-Line Lessons for NDHS

Please Follow Instructions Carefully!

During our time of isolation, we will all work together to continue to ensure that you get a quality education using well-planned, virtual instruction. It is our goal that you will continue to excel in your work and achieve your goals. If you are a graduating senior, it is especially important that you demonstrate your best efforts to meet all your graduation requirements.

Next week, March 23 through 27, your teachers will be planning their lessons and posting them on Google Classroom. Students, you will begin submitting your work through Google Classroom or other designated platforms as instructed, to your teachers, beginning Monday, March 30.

Students, it is imperative that you work diligently on EACH of your four courses and check in with your teachers every day. It is expected that students will work a minimum of five to six hours per day to complete the course work. Please make sure that you are carefully following your teachers' instructions and you are adhering closely to the due dates and deadlines. Students, you will check in with your teacher each class beginning with first period at 9:15 for second period at 10:45, third period at 1:00 and fourth period at 2:30 so that accurate attendance can be taken.

If you are having difficulty with Wi-Fi access, you may contact Spectrum. Thanks to Spectrum, free WiFi will be provided for 60-days to students and families in your service area. To enroll, parents should call 1-844-488-8395.

If you are still unable to log in to Google Classroom and access your communications, teachers will be providing paper copies of your work assignments. We will notify you next week on the assignment distribution process. Please follow all instructions for picking up your assignments and books. Students MAY NOT enter the NDHS campus except on specified dates and times. Parents and students, please stay in your cars and we will come out to your car.
